PC Tom Chalk recently investigated the shooting of a Peregrine Falcon near to Quanton. Both Tom and Dean are trained to investigate wildlife crime and respond to reports of such incidents across Aylesbury Vale. Recently Chyna and PCSO Denise Grayburn responded to a report of Hare Coursing at Oakley Airfield and their diligent and persistent enquiries led to a male being arrested for the offence and his dog seized.

The PCSOs have been busy visiting as many primary schools as possible delivering 'PC Ben' talks to the children. This is an initiative devised by TVP to get neighbourhood teams back into schools following the easing of COVID 19 restrictions and is being very well received by all of the children. We hope to get as many schools covered as we can in the lead up to Christmas.

We have seen several thefts from farms in recent weeks, including large agricultural machinery, tools and trailers. We ask farmers to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity to us ASAP. We now have a dedicated Whatsapp group for local farmers to contact us directly to report suspicious goings on and to pass quick time intelligence.

Our NH priority remains to reduce and deter rural crime across the neighbourhood.
